advice & consent aforesaid strictly charge & comand all & Lib. R. R. singuler his Lord<sup>pps</sup> Officers civill & military within this Province to take due Cognizance hereof & make strict Inquisition into & punctually observe the prmisses in & about their severall preincts & habitacons makeing preent seizure of any Shipp or Vessell that shall take in & load Aboard any of the p. 151 aforenamed Provisions with out leave & lycence first had & obtained as aforesaid All & singuler the Offenders herein to be by the next Magistrate bound to their good behaviour giveing good security for their appearance att the next Provinciall Court to answer such their contempt And to the end that no person whatsover herein concerned may plead or pretend ignorance all Officers & others duely qualified to enter & cleer Shipps & other Vessells in this Province as well on behalfe of his Matie our Sovereigne Lord the King of great Britaine as on behalfe of his Lord propry of this Province are hereby willed & required to Give notice hereof to all Merchants Or masters of Shipps or other Vessells upon the entring of such their Ships or Vessells. And whereas I am myselfe in person att preent indisposed & cannot be att St Maryes to signe this Proclamacon I doe therefore by & with the advice & consent aforesaid hereby authorize Ordaine & Empower the Honble Philip Calvert Esq<sup>r</sup> Chancelour of this Province to signe the same which is to be of as full force & validitie as if signed p my selfe. Given att the Citty of S<sup>t</sup> Maryes under the great Seale of this Province the fifth day of Septemb in the third yeare of the Dominion of the right Honble Charles &c. over this Province Annoq Domi 1678.

On Munday October the 7<sup>th</sup> 1678 the Governor p Lettr Did Lib. R. Desire the Advice of the Councell (then at S<sup>t</sup> Maries) for the settling of the militia in the severall ffrontire Counties for the Defence and Safeguard of the Inhabitants from the assaults and attempts of the Indians Dureing the sitting of the Assembly w<sup>ch</sup> was to beginn October the 20<sup>th</sup> 78;

To w<sup>ch</sup> on Thursday the 10<sup>th</sup> instant he recd. the foll. Lett<sup>r</sup> of Advice p the Post, viz.

Sir

We have recd: yors Dated yesterday together with the Lettr of Coll Thomas Tailler and the conference with the King of Mattawoman and Chotike, and Coll. Douglas his Lettr & yor ordr thereupon relateing to Hugh ffrench; We have taken the contents of the Lettr into Consideration and as to our Security against any attempts may be made by the Indians Dureing the time of the Assemblys Sitting We are of Opinion that the Common Rangers now undr pay in Charles County, Calvert County, Anne Arrundell County & Balte-
