Hereby willing and requireing all and singular the Inhabitants of this Province, and others tradeing or resideing here to be aideing and Assisting to you to the utmost of their powers in the Due Execution of this precept, Whereof neither y<sup>u</sup> nor they are to faile as yee will answer the contrary at yo<sup>r</sup> perill Dated the 29<sup>th</sup> Day of Ap<sup>l</sup> A<sup>o</sup> 1679:

Cap<sup>t</sup> John Harris According to summons makes his appearance and being again sworne and Examined Deposed as foll: viz

That he heard Cap<sup>t</sup> Josias ffendall say that he had been a greate Sufferer by the Chancelo<sup>r</sup> that he had been much abused & held Downe a long time, that now the time was come and he would right himself for that the times were now Difficult and troublesome, and he should find Disaffected p<sup>rs</sup>ons enough at the Cliffes & the Eastern Shore that would stand by him, and upon some other Discourse that they had concerning ffriggatts that were comeing in for the Lord Baltimore s<sup>d</sup> ffendall replied what need that, if he had but two or three lines out of England he would secure him & send him home without the charge of ffriggatts, all w<sup>ch</sup> the s<sup>d</sup> ffendall publicly uttered saying he cared not who heard him.

p. 84 Cap<sup>t</sup> Gerrard Slye being returned without executeing the p<sup>r</sup>cept to him Directed the said ffendall upon Diligent search and inquisition made not being to be found, His L<sup>spp</sup> and the Councill consider & consult what further course to be taken for the Discovery and apprehension of the said ffendall and it was advised and resolved that Cap<sup>ta</sup> Humphrey Warren of Charles County be Empowered and Commanded to make Diligent search after the said ffendall throughout the said County and to apprehend him wheresoever he shall be found, requireing all officers civill and Military within this Province & others the Inhabitants thereof to be aideing and assisting therein, and phibiting any of the said Inhabitants to entertaine
