Severall mutinous and seditious speeches (tending to the
breach of L^{spps}: peace within this Province) haveing been
lately uttered by Doctor James Barree severall evidences to
the same were this Day called and examined upon oath (viz)

Thomas Bennett saies that on Tuesday the 30th of Decemb:
last at night he came from on board shipp to Capt. Coodes
house on Wiccocomico River, where he found D^r James
Barree and severall other p^{sons} in Comp^a but how long they
had been there he knowes not, that he believes the said Barree
might be something in Drink, that said Barre hott in dis-
course with M^r Rosewell one of the Comp^a told him that he
was excommunicated for keepeing his X^{mas} with Hereticks,
and seemed to be very angry with Rosewell for being there,
and told him that he the said Barree was sent thither p^r some
p^{sons} to take notice of his words, at w^{ch} Rosewell shewed
much anger, Barree then further told him that there was now
ready a Troope of Horse consisting of 100 Catholickes und^r p. 98
Coll. Darnall and Thomas Courtney to cutt of all the Protest-
ants in Maryland and that in three Daies time, that he the
said Rosewell was one of the said Troope, whereupon Rose-
well grew very Cholerick and told him that he would take
him and burn him. Barree further replied that it was true
