At w^{ch} Time and place the Empero^r and greate men of Pascattoway came to acquaint his L^{spp}: that they had a greate desire to make a peace with all the Northern Indians both Sinnequos and Susquesahawnoks and to that End had prepared severall presents wherewith they designed to send some Agents of theirs to the Mattwas Indians to desire their assistance in the same.

But noe Interpreter being p^rsent save onely a Choptico Indian that could speake a little English his L^{spp} and Council waved further discourseing with them till the next day at w^{ch} time Thomas Baker of Charles County was commanded to give his attendance in the words foll. (viz)

By the Lord Prop^{ry} and Council

Ordered that Thomas Baker of Charles County (all excuses sett apart) be and p^rsonally appeare before his L^{spp} and the Council at Notley Hall on Wiccocomico River to morrow morning being the first of Aprill there to serve as Interpreter betweene his said L^{spp}: and Council, and the Pascattoway Indians in matters concerning the state of the Province Whereof he is not to faile Dated the 31th Day of March in the 5th year of his L^{spps} Dominion &c^a Annoq Domini 1680:
