all convenient speed

At the same time also ordered that a Lett<sup>r</sup> be writt to Coll  
George Wells requireing him when any of the Sinniquo  
Indians come downe into those parts he give speedy notice  
thereof to his L<sup>spp</sup>: and Councill as also to Jacob Young who  
is desired to endeavour a treaty with them and to know of  
them when and in what place neere the head of the Bay or else  
where in the Province they may be yearely spoken with in  
ord<sup>r</sup> to a faire correspondency and the preservation of our  
league and Amity with them

The Letter is as foll viz.

By ord<sup>r</sup> from the R<sup>t</sup> hon<sup>ble</sup> the Lord Prop<sup>ty</sup>  
and his Councill.

S<sup>r</sup> when you shall know or be informed that any of the  
Sinniquo Indians doe come downe into yo<sup>r</sup> parts you are to  
give speedy notice thereof to his L<sup>spp</sup>: and Councill, and in the  
meane time to advise Jacob Young that it is his L<sup>spps</sup>: desire  
he should endeavour by all waies and meanes possible to  
speake with some of the greate men and lett them know that  
his L<sup>spp</sup> is very desirous to continue his league and Amity with  
them and would willingly renew the same yearely by a  
mutuall Interview of some of the greate men of this Province  
and some of theirs in such manner and forme as is usuall with  
them on such occasions could he be acquainted therewith, and  
therefore desires that they will give his L<sup>spp</sup>: to understand  
where and at what time in every yeare neere the head of the  
Bay or elsewhere for their conveniency in this Province they  
may be spoken with, and that they would ascertain the time  
and place for that purpose, all which when effected lett be  
signified to his L<sup>spp</sup>: and Councill with all convenient speed,  
and his L<sup>spp</sup>: will take care that Jacob Young shall be Satisfied  
for his care and trouble herein.
