Whereas the R<sup>t</sup> hon<sup>ble</sup> the Lord Prop<sup>ry</sup> of this Province did formerly issue forth his ord<sup>r</sup> directed to the Sheriff of Kent County, that what he had seized of the Estate of Ellis Humphryes for his L<sup>spps</sup> vse should be by him redelivered to his wife his L<sup>spp</sup> haveing relinquished his right & title thereunto, The R<sup>t</sup> hon<sup>ble</sup> the Lord Prop<sup>ry</sup> doth now confirme the said former order and the sheriffe of Kent County aforesaid is hereby required to make restitution accordingly

That whereas in the yeare of our Lord 1676: one William Davis & severall other psons was in rebellion against your good L<sup>spp</sup>: and the good Governm<sup>t</sup> of this Province, and for that your Pet<sup>r</sup> by the said William Davis and others of his Company by faire words intreatyes and many insinuations did perswade your Pet<sup>r</sup> to go with them as One of their Company in the said Rebellion all which your Petitioner doth with a sorrowfull and contrite heart humbly confess to your L<sup>spp</sup> and laying himself at the ffeete of your L<sup>spps</sup> mercy humbly prayeth

That your good L<sup>spp</sup> will graciously be pleased to pardon your Pet<sup>r</sup> his said Offence and suffer your Petitioner to dwell in your L<sup>spps</sup> Province (w<sup>ch</sup> he promiseth to Doe as one of your L<sup>spps</sup> good and ffaithfull people for the future) without lett, hinderance or Disturbance for the said Offence

And as in Duty bound he shall ever pray

Which petition was granted and thus underwritten viz.

The petitioner well and truly abeareing himself with due obedience had to the Governm' and the Lawes of this Province hath his Offence remitted, and is free quietly to live in the Province and enjoy the fruits of his Labour
