incurred many Debts to effect the same.

That your Pet^r is still willing to give entertainem^t to the utmost of his power, and shall very speedily be furnished with provision and liquors Sufficient for the next Court, all which may turne to his utter ruine and Destruction, should your Petitioner noe longer continue in the said Employm^t or be p. 173 forced to procure security to perform the strictness of the Act in such cases made and provided.

Your Petitioner therefore humbly prayes that your L^{spp} would be graciously pleased to grant him a lycense for the year ensueing and accept of his owne Bond for the perform-

ance of his Duty in the said Employmt

And your Petr shall pray &c.

If the petitioner will produce Security according to the former ord of this board concerning Ordinary keepers he may have lycense granted him according to his prayer otherwise this board will not receed from their sd former ord
