Kent July the 13th 1680:

May it please your L^{spp}:

We the Justices of this County Court haveing had the peruseall of a Letter from your L^{spp} directed to Major James Ringold Dated the sixth day of Aprill last past, wherein your L^{spp} hath signified that the Court house and Prison of this County ought to be conveyed to your L^{spp} for the vse and benefitt of this County, in compliance of which we doe humbly present unto your L^{spp}: The cobby of a Conveyance drawne by the expertest Councill we could procure, which if your L^{spp} shall think it not a sufficient Conveyance we humbly Desire your L^{spp} would be pleased to order one of your Clerks to send up a Conveyance w^{ch} your L^{spp} shall approve off which shall be willingly and readily Signed and performed by

This Indenture made the _____ Day of _____ in the yeare of our Lord Christ 1680: and in the fffth yeare of the Dominion of Charles absolute Lord and Prop^{ty} of the Province of Maryland and Avalon Lord Baron of Baltemore &c^a Betweene James Ringold of Kent County in the Province of Maryland gentl of the one part and the said R^t hon^{ble} Charles Lord Baltemore of the other part Witnesseth that the said James Ringold for the considerations herein after mentioned, Hath Given granted Enffeoed and confirmed, and by these presents doth fully freely and absolutely give grant Enffeofoe and confirm unto the said Charles Lord Baltemore his heyres and Successo^{rs} for Ever all that building or structure lately erected by his L^{spps} Justices of Kent County aforesaid (together with the consent and approbation of the Inhabitants of Kent County aforesaid) being built onely for a Court house or house of Judicature for the said County and to or for noe other use intent or purpose whatsoever, together with a prison house or commone Gaole neere adjoyneing being also
