 blankett (w<sup>ch</sup> was found with you) out of the Nanjatico Indians  
 boate?  
 Ind: I said I saw such another in their boate

 brought from the Susquehannoh ffort, the other I know not it  
 belongs to the weomen  
 Int. where the hatt?  
 Ind. Coll Spencers maid lost it  
 Int. where the Stockings?
