May it please your L^{spp}:

I have received your L^{spps} Commands and the ord^r of Councill of the 19th instant, and shall to the utmost of my power comply with the same in every respect. I thought it necessary to give your L^{spp} acco^t of my being at Zachaiah fort this Day, where I found the Indians much troubled for
