R. or betray you or any of you or any English Plantation or People You are to the best of your skill knowledge and endeavour, and to the utmost of your might and power, to fall upon, pursue, fight, take, kill, vanquish and Destroy all such Enemys, or otherwise if you shall be at any time overpowered, you are to contrive and make what honble retreate possibly you cann with your Company for such further aid and assistance as shall be Deemed necessary for your Recruite with regard had to the number and power of your Enemy according to the tenor of your said Instructions; ffor all which this shall be your sufficient power.
