Cap<sup>t</sup> Josias ffendall then next called to whom was read the following Depositions viz

John Bright aged thirty and two yeares or thereabouts being duely sworne doth upon his oath say and Depose as followeth

That being about the 11th May last employed by Capth ffendall to Mall some railes for him at his Plantation in Charles County and there working till the fourth of June he did in that tyme and severall tymes since heare the said ffendall discourse concerning the Indians and particularly about the family that was cutt off neere Point looke Out, The said ffendall did severall times say that he beleived in his Conscience the Papists and Indians joined together, and that his L<sup>spp</sup> the Lord Prop<sup>ry</sup> nor the Chancelo<sup>r</sup> would not believe any thing as the Indians did doe but that my Lord did uphold them in what they did, and he beleived my Lord and they together had a mind to destroy all the Protestants or vsed words and expresions to that very purpose or effect, And this Deponent saith on Sunday the 26th day of June last Capth ffendalls and his wife went to Capt. Coodes to a ffeast being sent for in Capt Coodes boate and came home at night, That on Tuesday or Wednesday the 29th June Capt ffendall went over to Coll Spencers in one Mr Hatches boate, and beleives that he called by the way for Capt Coode and tooke him over with him, and Capt ffendall told this Deponent that Coode damned and swore soe much that he said he could have found in his heart to have throwne him overboard. That this Deponent haveing a Designe to goe to the Southward and to carry his ffamily wth him he bought a boate of Capt ffendall for to carry him thither, and Capt ffendall did then very much disswade
