The Sheriffes of each respective County are Ordered to make publiq Proclamacōn throughout their respective Countyes That all persons that have been att any Charge & Expences for Provision Amunicōn or otherwise about the said late Expeditōn in managing the warr ag<sup>t</sup> the Susquehanough Indians be & appeare att the nex<sup>t</sup> Provinc<sup>l</sup> Court to be holden att the City of S<sup>t</sup> Maryes the 16<sup>th</sup> day of this instant Novemb<sup>r</sup> or deliver their several Accompts thereof to the Sheriffes of each respective County that they may have the same ready to deliver in to the Governo<sup>r</sup> & Councell att the said Court Given &<sup>c</sup>
