The foregoeing Commission and Instructions Letter of Creditt and Letter to the Governor of New Yorke together with the Originalls of the last peace made at Albany by Coll Coursey with the Northern Indians were all delivered into the hands of Coll Lloyd at Mattapony Sewall the 15th Day of May 1682:

Charles Absolute Lord and Propry of the Provinces of

Maryland & Avalon Lord Baron of Baltemore &ca

To all persons to whom these presents shall come greeteing in our Lord God Everlasting. Whereas his Sacred Majie our dread Sovraigne the King of England &ca hath by his Letters Pattents lately granted unto William Penn Esq a certain tract of Land in these parts of America by the name of Pensilvania to beginn and take its Originall or first Departure from the flourtieth Degree of Northern Latitude the bounds and confines of this our Province of Maryland, And whereas his said Majtie at the humble suite & request of the said William Penn hath vouchsafed to write unto us. Requiring us by our Self or our Sufficient constitutes to joine with some others Authorised by the said William Penn in the due observing and ascertaining the said fourtieth Degree of Northern Latitude to the end that the sd William Penn might be the better Enabled to know and Distinguish the true precincts, meetes and bounds of the part or Province Assigned him and granted
