

Liber R. Maryland ss:

I Philip Calvert Esq<sup>r</sup> Privy Councillor and one of his L<sup>dspps</sup> Justices of the Provinciaall Court of this Province, To the sheriffe of S<sup>t</sup> Maries County greeteing, I send you here with-  
all the body of Jacob Young late of Cecill County planter,  
Sealed brought before his L<sup>dsp</sup> and Councill this Day and  
charged with stimulateing and encouraging the  
Indians to make Incursions and Attempts upon the English  
Inhabitants & neighbouring ffriend Indians of this Province,  
And therefore these are (on the behalf of the R<sup>t</sup> hon<sup>ble</sup> the  
Lord Prop<sup>ty</sup>) to Comānd you that immediately you receive the  
s<sup>d</sup> Jacob Young and him in safe Close custody keepe untill he  
shall be thence delivered by the due ord<sup>r</sup> of the next generall  
Assembly. Hereof faile not as you will answer for your con-  
tempt at your perill. Given at S<sup>t</sup> Maries the Tenth day of  
September in the Seaventh yeare of the Dominion of the R<sup>t</sup>  
hon<sup>ble</sup> Charles &c<sup>a</sup> Annoq Dmi. 1682:

To the sheriff of S<sup>t</sup> Maries County Philip Calvert  
or his Deputy  
These.

Information given by M<sup>r</sup> English that the Northern Indians  
not well agreeing among themselves when they mett at the  
head of the Bay about the prisoners and booty that had been  
taken (some of them not haveing any) were prepareing Canoes  
and makeing ready to returne again to the Eastern shore to  
take what more they could

Ordered thereupon that the Indians on the Eastern Shore  
have speedy notice given th<sup>m</sup> thereof to prevent their being  
surprised and to make provision for them & that the sheriffe  
of Dorchester County as nearest to them be required to give  
such notice according to the following ord<sup>r</sup> viz.

By the Lord Prop<sup>ty</sup> & Councill

Sep<sup>r</sup> 10<sup>th</sup> 1682

Information being this Day given to his L<sup>dspp</sup> and Councill  
that there are some of the Northern Indians (who have as yett  
taken noe booty) upon their Return back to make their  
Attempts upon the Indians on the Eastern Shoare. You are  
therefore hereby Required forthwith upon sight hereof to give  
notice to Ababco, and the rest of the Kings and other Indians  
in your parts of such Intentions of the said Northern Indians,  
p. 336 that they may not be surprised by them, but stand ready upon  
their guard and posture of Defence. This by order from his  
L<sup>dsp</sup> and Councill is peremptorily Commanded you and signi-  
fied by John Llewelin Cl Consil
