B. knows his Royall highnesse to be a Prince of more Justice, Honour, and goodnesse, then to owne Mr William Penn in his Late proceedings, so he is Encouraged and resolued to seeke for his Just right, which his Royall Highnesse has assured the L. B: he shall haue. Tho Prince Penn hopes and fully assureth himselfe the Contrary.
