His L<sup>dspp</sup> acquaints this board that he had according to Coll Lloyds request Empowered him to send for the neighbouring Indians and give them such satisfaction from the acknowledgm<sup>t</sup> of the wounded Indian as is expressed in the Letter and also had signified to him his L<sup>spps</sup> approbation of his proceedings soe farr in this affaire which is also approoved by this board.

Ordered that Proclamation issue prohibiting the selling giveing or disposeing of to any Indians, whatsoever any drams or other strong liquors whilest they are at or about the English plantations under paine of incurring his L<sup>spps</sup> heavy displeasure.

Ordered also that Proclam<sup>a</sup> issue prohibiting the exportation of Indian Corne or Wheate under the like paine of incur-

ring his L<sup>spps</sup> heavy displeasure.

## [Selling Liquors to Indians.]

By the Lord Propry a Proclamation Whereas the giveing selling or disposeing of to the Indians useing or frequenting the English plantations within this Province, Brandy, Rumm and other strong liquors in such Quantitys as to render them drunk and mad, hath oftentimes prooved and hereafter may be of very fatall Consequence to this Province, the masters or Owners of such liquors not onely createing to themselves thereby their owne trouble and disturbance with the hazard of their owne lives, but also endangering bringing upon the Province a chargeable and expensive Warr in case of any murder insolency or mischiefe committed or done by such Indians drunk and mad as aforesaid; Which to prevent for the tyme to come, and to Establish as much as may be the future peace and tranquility of this Province with p. 10 the lives and Safeties of the Inhabitants thereof, We have considered and thought fitt, And wee doe by and with the advice and consent of our Councill hereby strictly prohibitt and forbid all and singular the Inhabitants of this Province, and other psons whatsoever tradeing comeing into or at any tyme resideing within the same of what degree or Quality soever at any tyme hereafter to give sell barter for or other-
