Ordered that the summe of twelve pence sterl in ready money or twenty pounds of tobacco be hereafter paid to the Doore keeper of the Councill for the tyme being as a ffee settled on him by this board for every petition preferred to his L<sup>sp</sup>p in Councill, and that the Clerk of the Councill take care to secure the same with and as well as his owne ffees being Tenn shillings sterl or Two hundred pounds of Tobacco for every petition as aforesaid Now and hereby settled upon him
