The oath of Deputies and Commission<sup>rs</sup> to the hon<sup>ble</sup> Benedict Leonard Calvert Esq<sup>r</sup> was then Administred to Coll Taillor, Coll Digges, Coll Stevens, and Coll Burges

The oath of Councillor of State was also Administred unto the aforesaid Coll Taillor Coll Digges, Coll Stevens, and Coll Burges, and to Mr Edward Pye also.

Came Mr Robert Carville and prayed that pursuant to an ord<sup>r</sup> of his L<sup>spp</sup> and Councill the 29<sup>th</sup> of Aprill last upon his humble petition then preferred he may be now admitted to Enter into single Recognizance himself before the hon<sup>ble</sup> the Commissaryes or Secrys or any or either of them, in discharge of his sureties given to the Prov<sup>ll</sup> Court w<sup>ch</sup> was granted, and his Recognizance accordingly taken before the hon<sup>ble</sup> John Darnall Esq<sup>r</sup> one of his L<sup>sps</sup> Secrys, and is as foll viz:

Memd: the ffour and Twentyeth day of June in the ninth yeare of the Dominion of the R<sup>t</sup> hon<sup>ble</sup> Charles &c: over this Province Annoq Dmi: 1684 came before me John Darnall Esq<sup>r</sup> Secretary and one of his L<sup>dsp</sup>s Justices of the Provinciaall Court, Robert Carville of the County of S<sup>t</sup> Maries, and acknowledged himself to owe and be justly indebted unto the R<sup>t</sup> hon<sup>ble</sup> the Lord Prop<sup>ry</sup> of this Province in the full and just summe of ffourty pounds Lawfull currant money of England, To be leavyed of his goods & Chattells Lands and Tenem<sup>ts</sup> upon condition foll; that if the said Robert Carville shall well behave himself, and be of good abearance as well towards his L<sup>sp</sup>: the said Lord Prop<sup>ry</sup> as to all and singular the good people of this Province, for and untill the next Provinciaall Court to be holden for the said Lord Prop<sup>ry</sup> at the City of S<sup>t</sup> Maries, then the above Recognizance to be void and of none effect or else to stand in good force power and vertue in Law
