R. bound unto the R<sup>t</sup> hon<sup>ble</sup> the Lord Prop<sup>ty</sup> of this Province in the full and just summe of Thirty pounds of good and Lawfull money of England to be leavyed of my goods Chattells Lands & Tenem<sup>ts</sup> for the use of the said Lord Prop<sup>ty</sup> And I John Hiland doe likewise hereby acknowledge my self to be holden and firmly bound unto the said R<sup>t</sup> hon<sup>ble</sup> the Lord Prop<sup>ty</sup> in the summe of ffifteene pounds of Lawfull money of England to be leavyed of my Goods & Chattells Lands & Tenements, upon Condition that if the above bound Henry Higgs doe & shall well and truly make his psonall appeareance before his L<sup>sp</sup>s Hon<sup>ble</sup> Councill of State to be held at the City of S<sup>t</sup> Maries the last Tuesday of November next ensueing, to answer to such matters and things as shall then and there be objected ag<sup>t</sup> him by the said Councill of State on behalf of the said Lord Prop<sup>ty</sup> and that the said Henry Higgs be of good abeareance and behaviour in the meane time towards all manner of persons whatsoever That then this present deed of Recognizance to be void, or else to remaine in full force and vertue. Sealed with our Seales and dated this fourth day of October in the yeare of our Lord One thousand Six hundred Eighty ffoure.
