

The Deposition of John Watson of S^t Maries County aged five and thirty yeares or thereabouts Lib. R. R. R.

The Deponent upon oath examined saith that sometime in the moneth of July last past, he being on board the Mann of Warr Ketch Cap^t Thomas Allen Command^r then at Anchor in Pottomock River falling into discourse with the Captain, and being asked from whence he came, he the Deponent said, from Maryland side, the Dep^t asked him, from whence he came, he answered from Whitehall, and said he understood the King was cheated in his customs both in Maryland and Virginia, that many shipps came in here, which had not their due cleareings from England, all w^{ch} he was to looke after; The Deponent said th^t if the King were cheated of his customs, My Lord Baltemore was also cheated, & further he saith not

Whereas wee have been credibly informed that Cap^t William Wheeler hath lately and frequently uttered diverse revileing and reproachfull speeches tending to the derogation of his L^{sp}s Governm^t and the disturbance of the peace of this Province. These are therefore to will and require as also strictly to charge and command you in the name of the R^t hon^{ble} the Lord Prop^{ry} to apprehend and take into yo^r custody the body of the said William Wheeler, and him safely keepe,
