Novemb the 28th 1684:

Being at M^r Llewelins at S^t Maries in Company of M^r Butler, M^r Llewelin and some others, Cap^t Wheeler came in, and we askt him what news, he said he heard from the Kings Ketch lately, I thereupon askt him how it stood with Coll Talbott, and what was determined concerning him, he answered that the Councill in Virginia sate about him a Thursday then last past, and soe nothing knowne yett what was done: In
 p. 151 further discourse I said that I thought that Cap^t Allen ought to have made his report to the Governm^t at his comeing in he answered that Cap^t Allen knew what he had to doe aswell as I could tell him, and that he wore the Kings fflag; I said soe might a privateere or an Algerine, and that I did not beleive the King would grant any such Commission that should out brave or top any Governm^t under the King, or words to that Effect, but that he would have them make their Report to the Governo^r ffor I said the King himself is a Govern^r and Govern^rs three Kingdomes, and that his Maj^{ty} desired Governm^t should be maintained, and not trifled upon, Then said
