John Kirk owned the killing of ffour heads of the aforementioned ffurlongs Cattle, and are as foll:

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But Denyes the killing of any hogs although I charge him with it by information that he had killed up his Stock of hogs: he still owne the Estate of ffurlongs to be his owne, and would not deliver them as ffurlongs, but as Cattle that came from ffurlongs plantation.
