## James the Second's Instructions

## James R

Our Will and Pleasure is, that Our Right Trusty and Welbeloved Charles Lord Baltimore give Order, and take particular care, that the following Instructions be strictly observed and followed by all Officers and other persons, whom it may concerne, in Our Province of Maryland.

- 1. You are well and truly to informe yourselfe of the Principall Laws relating to the Plantation Trade, viz. The Act of Navigation made in the 12<sup>th</sup> year of the Reigne of the late King Our most dear Brother deceased. The Act of Trade made in the 15<sup>th</sup> year of the said King's Reigne. The Act for regulating the Plantation Trade made in the 22 and 23 years of the said King's Reigne; and The Act for better securing the Plantation Trade made in the 25<sup>th</sup> year of the said King's Reign, being conteined in a Book of Rates herewith delivered to you for your further information.
- 2. You are to take notice That by the Act of Navigation no Goods or Comodities whatsoever are to bee Imported into or Exported out of Our Province of Maryland, or any other of Our Colonies or Plantations in any other Ships or Vessells whatsoever, but in such as do truly and without fraud belong only to our Subjects of this Our Kingdome of England, or Ireland, Wales, or Town of Berwick
