

Lib. R. R. R. and be paid him for the adjudgement of the age of every Servant the summe of Two shillings and six pence sterl; or thirty pounds of tob^o to be paid by the Master of such Servant as shall be adjudged. And that the s^d Clk shall have and be paid him for every ord^r two shillings sterl or twenty pounds of tobacco, and for every petition preferred to this Court, two shillings and six pence sterl: or thirty pounds of Tobacco. All which ffees, and other ffees that shall or may be any waies due to the Clk of this Court, shall be recovered by way of Execution upon the Body goods or Chattells of such p^{son} or p^{sons} from whom the same shall or may be due.

Item. It is further Enacted Established and ordeined that the Constable of S^t Maries City, doe twice on Every Sunday (that is to say, once in the morning, and once in the afternoone) goe up and downe, & search the severall Ordinaryes within the s^d City, and libertys thereof to see what Rules, and Orders, are kept, and shall at every Mayo^{rs} Court held for the said City, present and Testifye upon Oath what Evill Rules and Ord^{rs} are kept in any either or all of the said Ordinaryes on Sundayes or Sabboth dayes aforesaid.

Item. It is further Ordeined Established and Enacted as aforesaid, that if any the Ordinary keepers within this City or liberties thereof presume to sell any manner of liquors w^{soever} by any other measure then what shall be proportionable to the measures, that are already stamped and allotted as a Standard for the s^d City, and w^{ch} are in the custody of M^r John Baker, that He, she or they presumeing soe to doe shall be deemed to sell liquors by false measures, and is guilty of the breach of the Act of Assembly relateing to Ordinary Keepers, and this Court will take advantage against them as is mentioned in the said Act

Item. It is further Enacted ordeined & Established that noe person or p^{sons} whatsoever presume to keepe Ordinary within the said City of S^t Maries or libertys thereof, without lycense from this Court first had and obtained, Any persons soe presumeing as aforesaid, shall be deemed an Ordinary keeper without lycense and comes und^r the penalye of the act of Assembly in that case made and provided.

Item. Whereas Complaint hath been made to this Court by severall Inhabitants of the said City of the very greate damage and mischiefes that are done by hoggs kept within
 p. 268 the said City or libertyes thereof, or places neere adjacent thereto, by killing the Poultry, rooteing up the Gardens, and fields, and otherwise; It is therefore Enacted, ordeined and Established that noe person whatsoever Inhabiting within the Oldfield of this City shall for the future raise or keepe, any hoggs piggs, Soves or Barrowes, without they be kept in a
