saying he had hired the roome of Newton and to him had Liber R. paid storeage.

M<sup>r</sup> James ffrisby saith that he knows or cann say little or nothing of his owne knowledge but what he has heard from others these transactions of M<sup>r</sup> Inglish happening when he was at St Maries upon the Assembly, but he hath been informed the very same that now is charged to M<sup>r</sup> Inglish.

M<sup>r</sup> William Peerce saith to the same effect that these things happened when he was upon the Assembly but he hath heard severall persons complain of the proud insolent carriage and behaviour of Mr Inglish who had given generall distaste and dissatisfaction to the whole County by delaying and putting off the Courts, that the chiefe motive of his subscribeing the petition was that before he returned into the County he was informed by a person liveing in the County who meeteing with M<sup>r</sup> Inglish enquired of him what time the Burgesses would returne to which the said Inglish replyed what knew he it might be the latter end of October. he also told the said Peerce that he beleived the people in the County would rise.

Mr Nathan Garratt saith that he knows little of himself but that generally the people in the County murmured and were much dissatisfied at putting off the Courts by meanes of M<sup>r</sup> Inglish.

Richard Adames saith that when M Inglish attached the Commission he told them he would make them know themselves, and but the day before said in hearing of him the s<sup>d</sup> Adames that there should be noe Court.

Whereunto Mr Inglish haveing made his Defence and being duely heard they were dismissed and the further consideration thereof his L<sup>dsp</sup> and Councill would take unto themselves.

John Thompson Clerk of Cæcill County appointed in the p. 291 roome of Swithen Wells make Complaint that the said Swithen refuseth to deliver to him some of the Records of the said County being thereunto required whereupon issued the following ord viz.

Whereas Swithen Wells late Clark of Cecil County by an order from the honble the Secry of this Province being peremptorily required to deliver unto John Thompson now Clark of the said County all and singular the Records Papers Transcripts and Minuts of and belonging to the sd County Court, hath notwithstanding the sd ordr and in contempt thereunto obstinately refused to deliver some of the said Records and Papers aforesaid.

Ordered therefore that William Peerce and James ffrisby of Cecil County gentl and Comission of the said County Court
