Lemaire viz

To the R<sup>t</sup> hon<sup>ble</sup> the Lord Prop<sup>ry</sup> in Councill Sitting &c<sup>a</sup>

The humble Petition of John Lemaire of Charles County  
humbly Sheweth

That at a Provinciall Court held at the City of S<sup>t</sup> Maries  
the 15<sup>th</sup> day of ffebruary 1680: your Petitioner obteyned  
judgem<sup>t</sup> against George Godfrey of the same County for  
ffifty pounds of Tobacco Damage and 365<sup>2</sup><sup>l</sup> of tob<sup>o</sup> Costs of  
Suite, and also hath due unto him from the said Godfrey 520<sup>l</sup>  
tob<sup>o</sup> for Medicines administred to his ffamily by his ord<sup>r</sup> all  
which Tobacco the said Godfrey being lately convicted cannot  
obteine, and although your Petitioner is informed your L<sup>dsp</sup>  
hath graciously granted the said Godfrey his whole Estate  
fforfeited to your L<sup>dsp</sup> by such Conviction aforesaid yett the  
said Godfrey doth utterly refuse to pay your Petitioner his just  
dues aforesaid

Your Pet<sup>r</sup> therefore humbly prayes Releife in the p<sup>r</sup>misses  
and that your Pet<sup>r</sup> may be ordered the said Tobacco so due  
to him as aforesaid amounting in the whole 4222<sup>l</sup> of tobacco  
out of the Estate of the s<sup>d</sup> Godfrey so forfeited as afores<sup>d</sup>

And your Pet<sup>r</sup> as in Duty bound shall pray &c.

The charges of Godfreys guards and Imprisonm<sup>t</sup> with some  
other debts ordered by his L<sup>dsp</sup> to be paid being Satisfyed out  
of the Estate, the Remaind<sup>r</sup> thereof his L<sup>dsp</sup> hath bestowed on  
the wife and Children of the s<sup>d</sup> Godfrey for their necessary  
support and maintenance. W<sup>ch</sup> is his L<sup>dspps</sup> answer to the  
above Petition.
