p. 305 Philip Coomes upon Oath Examined saith that sometime in October last past or thereabouts he this Deponent being then very ill went to the Mill at the head of Wiccomico River to speake with Docto^r George, whom this Deponent not finding there went into the Company of Thomas Marshall, who in his discourse in the heareing of this Deponent said he would be one of the fourty men (if he were well mounted) that should goe downe to take the Lord Prop^{ry} and the hon^{ble} Chancelo^r and kill them, for said he I have Letters now at this Present in the house, of other persons but they shall be nameless at this time, and I should not have said what I have said, but that I take you to be my ffrinds all that are here.
