That he hath often been lately amongst the Indians to buy skinns of them and they did informe this Examinant, that all that they could gett they had lately disposed off to the s^d John Pryor M^rchant that keepeth store at Westwood, and to One James Smallwood of Charles County, and that this Examinant heard Cap^t James Bowleing say that he heard M^r Mudd say that he had seene skinns at Westwood store.
