By the Assembly September 22th 1694.

Wee the Deputies & Delegates now Assembled.

Doe most heartily congratulate your Ex^{ncys} Access & Safe
Arrivall to the Governm^t with a reall beliefe your Comeing will
be for our good & benefitt, fame having already proclaimed
your worthy actions done in other places And your begining
amongst Us gives Us great assurance you will continue the
same Unto Us in humble Confidence of Which Wee beseech
your Ex^{ncy} to Accept our humble & hearty thanks for the
favours already received and also to believe that as Wee are
obliged to Uphold & Assert the Just Rights & priviledges
of those Wee Represent soe our Actions shall ever demon-
strate us truly Loyall to their Most Sacred Maj^{ties} & behave our
selves with all due Respects towards Your Ex^{ncy} as becomes
