Parker against whom the said Moor had commenced an Lib. H. D. Action in the Provinciall Court but for above these ffive years had been delayed for want of the said Evidence appearing being distempered in Body and Vnable to Travell.

The Prayer of the Petitioner is granted and Ordered that the same be performed according to Law.
