Seaven of the Nine Still live all or most now at S^t Maries with the Clerk th^t Witt^{em}; and in perpetuum Rei Memoriam Pray, they may be Enter'd and Recorded in such proper Bookes and Offices as yo^r Exce^{ncy} and this Hono^{ble} Board shall thinke fitt, wth Ord^r that in all and every part the same Inviolably be for ever kept, Observed, And performed to all persons whom it doth or may Concerne, th^t they, wth me, may allwayes pray Whitehall
