1694

Upon Representation ordered that an Embargo  
and Stop be put upon all Ships & Vessells bound  
for Europe Untill the first day of Novembr<sup>r</sup> next and  
th<sup>t</sup> no such Ships be Cleared to Sayle by any of  
their Maj<sup>ties</sup> Collectors w<sup>th</sup> in this Province before that day and  
that no such Ships as Afsd be Afterwards Cleared untill fur-  
ther Order w<sup>ch</sup> is Supposed will not be till Christmas or after  
And that the ffleet be made up in Petuxant River except the  
two Ships in Potomock whereof all persons concerned are to  
take due Notice

Septemb<sup>r</sup> the 29<sup>th</sup> 1694

In reading over a Letter Sent from his Exce<sup>ncy</sup> S<sup>r</sup> p. 66  
Edmond Androse to the Honob<sup>le</sup> Coll Nicholas  
Greenbery then President of their Maj<sup>ties</sup> Councill  
here Dated 19<sup>th</sup> of March 1693 A Clause therein  
was inserted as follows Viz<sup>t</sup> I hear it Objected th<sup>t</sup>  
you have not taken the Oath for observance of the  
Oaths of Trade and Plantacōns Enjoyed by S<sup>d</sup> Act on pen-  
alty therein w<sup>ch</sup> I think Necessary to intimate; his Exc<sup>ncy</sup> there-  
upon did aske the S<sup>d</sup> Coll Greenbery whether he had taken  
the S<sup>d</sup> Oaths who makes Answer th<sup>t</sup> he has not taken the s<sup>d</sup>  
Oaths, the same never being tendered to him by S<sup>r</sup> Edmond  
or any other person
