Androse His Exce<sup>ncy</sup> does demand w<sup>ch</sup> way the S'd S<sup>r</sup> Edmond came over and w<sup>ch</sup> way he made his returne To w<sup>ch</sup> is Answered that the first of his coming over was cross Potomocke River to this City of S<sup>t</sup> Maries directly and that he went by Land to Maj<sup>r</sup> Sewalls at Petuxent w<sup>ch</sup> is about twelve miles from the S'd City and from thence went on Board their Maj<sup>ties</sup> ffrigott the Henry Prize and So returned to Virginia.

Whitehall That his Second comeing was from Virginia in a Boat Cross Potomock River to the City Afsd w<sup>ch</sup> is about Six Leagues and returned the same way back again. His Exce<sup>ncy</sup> does further demand whether the S'd S<sup>r</sup> Edmond did at either the Same times comeing Over take any View of the Militia or do any publick Act besides what Appears in the proceedings of the Journall of the Council and whether he brought w<sup>th</sup> him any Sort of Strong Liquors To w<sup>ch</sup> the Gent<sup>n</sup> of the Council make Answer that the S'd S<sup>r</sup> Edmond went not so much as out of S<sup>t</sup> Maries Save in his goeing to Maj<sup>r</sup> Sewalls in his Returne backe to Virginia and that no publick act was by him done other than what in the Journall of the Council is Afore expressed And that he brought no strong Liquors w<sup>th</sup> him

Whitehall and alsoe to State the same here (pursueant to my duty) I have rendered to his Exce<sup>ncy</sup> and Acco<sup>t</sup> of payments made out of their Maj<sup>ties</sup> Revenue as also what hath been by me Col- lected for their Maj<sup>ties</sup> Use here and doe find a difficulty and obstruction in passing that Article of ffive hundred pounds Ster<sup>r</sup> paid Yo<sup>r</sup> Exce<sup>ncy</sup> when last here His Exce<sup>ncy</sup> the Governor being dessirous of a further Satisfaction from Yo<sup>r</sup> Self then what I can give him upon what Acco<sup>t</sup> It was paid the Money being Wanted here for Supply of Armes and Amuni- tion pursueant to their Maj<sup>ties</sup> Comāds besides S<sup>r</sup> Thomas is to be Allowed his Sallery as President, I must presume to
