His Exce<sup>ncy</sup> does further demand of the Gentlemen of the Councill to consider if they have any thing else to propose or Offer either for the Service of their Maj<sup>ties</sup> or the Countrey to w<sup>ch</sup> they make Answer that at present they know nothing further to propose.

appear and be forth coming to Stand and abide their Sacred Ma<sup>ts</sup> determination whensoever they shall be thereunto Required by his Ex<sup>ncy</sup> the Governo<sup>r</sup>, with which they both declared themselves Contented.
