Lib. C. B. all ships tradeing on the Easterne shore to Repaire to such place as the Collector or Collectors there shall Order & appoint for their most convenient Cleareing & sayleing as directed, And vpon their Cleareing that the severall Collectors take security of the said Masters for their sayleing to their Convoys at Point Comfort, of which the Collectors are to give present Notice to all Masters & Comanders of ships, and they and all others concerned to conforme therevnto accordingly.
