A Lettr believed to be from your Ex^{ncy} (without a name) wth a vote of the Burgesses of Maryland and result of the Councill in Assembly there was directed & Presented to his Ex^{ncy} the Govern^r of this Province defeating our hopes of such Assistance his Ma^{ty} Royall Letter commanded expressing somewhat about Indians &^{ca} and the vast Sumes of Money and Tobacco in arreares & now to be paid &^{ca}

Among these Wee signify to Y^r Ex^{ncy} that the Governm^t of Maryland is indebted to this the sume of 453^{lb} sterl: being Money charge and Damages due on protested Bills of Exchange from Maryland as by the inclosed cobby of the Protest and Acco^t appears.
