Upon Reading a Petition of Coll Henry Darnall the Lord Baltmores Agent Setting forth that his Lo<sup>ps</sup>Dues are much lessened for want of the Ships making due Report of their Lading, therein praying that all Ships & Vessells hereafter Coming in & trading w<sup>th</sup>in this Province may make due Entry of their said Ships & Vessells at their first coming in, w<sup>th</sup> his Lo<sup>ps</sup> Officers, Ordered thereupon that all Masters of Ships & other Vessells for the future coming in & trading w<sup>th</sup>in this Province apply themselves to and make due Entry w<sup>th</sup> the Lord Baltmores Officers & give Bond for the Just paym<sup>t</sup> of his Lo<sup>ps</sup> Dues provided the said Officers shall not exact any Reward for the same, And that his Lo<sup>p</sup> keep Officers convenient to the places where his Ma<sup>ts</sup> Officers are placed, And according to Act of Assembly, one at Annapolis & a Nother at Williamstadt.
