Maryland ss Proclamation

Proclamacon relating to the Death of the Queen & alteracōn of all process &ca of this Province

Whereas it hath been Signified unto me by a Letter recd from the hono<sup>ble</sup> John Povey Esq<sup>r</sup> one of the Clerks of his Ma<sup>ts</sup> Most hono<sup>ble</sup> Privy Councill and Dep<sup>ty</sup> Secretary of his Ma<sup>ts</sup> Plantations bearing date the 9<sup>th</sup> day of March past how that it hath pleased Almighty God to take unto him self her late Ma<sup>ty</sup> Queen Mary (of ever blessed and Glorious Memory) and of the Great and irreparable loss is thereby sustained And Forasmuch as upon all such Accidents there is a Necessity for the Alteracon of the Course and Manner of the Severall process and proceedings had & used in the Respective Courts &ca I have therefore (by and with the Advice of his Ma<sup>ts</sup> hono<sup>ble</sup> Councill) thought fit to publish and Make known, And I doe hereby accordingly Order & Comānd that from hence forward & for the future all & all manner of Writts, Writings, precepts, & process Whatsoever Judiciall or otherwise issuing forth of any his Ma<sup>ts</sup> Courts or the Offices &ca within this Province, do beare Stile & ruñe in the Name of his Ma<sup>ty</sup> King William the third &ca Willing and Requiring the severall Sherriffes of the Province to make Proclamation hereof in the Most publick & convenient places within their Respective Counties to w<sup>ch</sup> all persons here in any wise concerned are to Yeild all ready and due Obedience, as they and every of them will answer the Contrary at their perrill Given under the Great Seale of the Province this 19<sup>th</sup> day of August in the 7<sup>th</sup> Year of his Ma<sup>ts</sup> Reign Annoq Domi: 1695.

Coll fletcher's Lettr Relating to Assistance from this Province & Ord<sup>r</sup> thereon &ca

His Ex<sup>ncy</sup> Signifying his Receipt of a Lett<sup>r</sup> frō his Ex<sup>ncy</sup> Coll Benj<sup>a</sup> Fletcher Govern<sup>r</sup> of New Yorke dated 17<sup>th</sup> of June last, requiring thereby Assistance from this Province of 160 men w<sup>th</sup> their proper Officers towards the Defence of his Ma<sup>ts</sup> Province of New York in pursuance of her Ma<sup>ts</sup> Royall Lett<sup>r</sup> bearing date the 22<sup>d</sup> day of August 1694: Whereupon was Ordered to be inspected her Ma<sup>ts</sup> said Lett<sup>r</sup> upon perusall whereof there did not appear any Officers therein Mentioned;
