but one day does not allow me leizure to give your Exney such satisfaction therein as perhaps upon further time, maturer deliberation and more strict Examination then the shortness of the present time will permit I might be able to do, but howp. 230 ever my obedience is such that I will rather Rune, the Risque of mistaking in point of Memory in my reading then disobeying your Exncies Commands, wherefore as to the Question In the first place I make a distinction between a Court of Delegates as the constitution of this Province stands and a Court of Delegates absolutely to be Governed by the Civill Law, Common Law & Statute Law of England, because that some Acts of Assembly of this Province do according to our constitution alter some matters relating to Causes cognizable by a Court of Delegates, as particularly the Act for preservation of Orphans Estates, but in generall I am of Opinion that the Jurisdiction of a Court of Delegates in this Province extends to Examin the justness of any sentence given by the Comissary Generall in any cause belonging to his Jurisdiction, which I look voon only to be matters testamentary and Letters relating to Admrcons as passing of Accounts, the justness of the Article thereof the Division of intestates Estates, Right of Admrcon &ca But by a Court of Delegates in England not only the aforesd Matters are cognoscible but likewise Matters Matrimoniall, matters relating to Tythes matters of spiritual defamation, beating of Clerks &ca so that the Jurisdiction of such a Court in this province is in a great measure abridged by
