Jacob Young Came & appeared in Councill Jacob Young & & Wm York William York living vpon Susquehanna River, and p. 239 keepe fferry it being proposed to them in Councill the keeping a &ca at Susfferry & Ordinary vpon each side the sd River, William York on this side the River & Jacob Young on the other side for which is settled vpon them, One shilling six whitehall pence for the passage of a horse & Man and One shilling for a flootman, to which they both Agreed; his Exncy giving them caution duly to observe the Acts of Assembly touching conveying persons over that River; Ordered that the Justices of the County Courts where they live grant them Lycense accordingly, they giving Bond as the Law in that Case directs.
