It Remains only further that We Remind you of the Act of Trade made in the 15th year of the Reign of King Charles the Second, which provides that no European Goods (except what is therein Excepted) Shall be Imported into any of his Mats Plantations but such as shall be loaden and Shipped in England Wales or Berwick and in Ships and Vessells quallifyed and Navigated as therein is Directed, under the penalty of forfeiture of Ship and Goods, and every person or persons Importing any Goods or Commodities whatsoever into any of the plantations, is by the s^d Act to Deliver to Each respective Govern^r or the Person Authorized by him within Twenty four hours after such Importation, their Names and S^r Names, and a true Inventory and particular of all Such Goods, together with the place or places in w^{ch} the s^d Goods were loaden or taken in Under the like penalty's of fforfeitures.
