Moreover being credibly informed of the great desire the Ottowa Indians have to be at peace with the English & Maquass of Albany they being a stout numerous & Warlike Nation, whose number, courage & trade the ffrench dreads the loss off Severall of the Chief in request among them have earnestly intreated some of our English Captives to the ffrench to advertize the same to the Governor of New-York and that if he will send his Maquass with terms of peace they will readily Agree to it, many of them not only so, but will joyne in a body of a thousand with the English & Maguass of Albany to invade any part of Canida, and likewise bring all their great Trade of peltry to Us, being much more near to them than Canida, all which will prove of very great loss & disadvantage to the Enemy.
