Came Coll Ninian Beale before his Excell the Govern^r & the hono^{ble} Coll Charles Hutchins, who signifying that he had brought an Indian belonging to the Emperour of piscattoway, being surrender'd vp by the s^d Empero^r & his great Men, as a suspicious person to have been concern'd in the Murther lately Committed in those parts, and of his threatning to bring fforraign Indians to do mischief there; as by a paper vnder the s^d Empero^r & two other of the great Mens hands produced, did appear; Wherevpon the s^d Indian being sent for & examined, was Committed into the Custody of the Sherriff to be close confined.
