

Lib. H. D. amount to 104<sup>lbs</sup> 17<sup>s</sup> 07<sup>d</sup> Sterl Ordered that half of the s<sup>d</sup>  
 Whitehall Revenue be lodged in m<sup>r</sup> Platers hands to be employed towards  
 p. 373 the fixing the publick Arms of the province; such of them as  
 can be fixed conveniently here, and that the Colonel of each  
 respective County take Care to see the s<sup>d</sup> Arms well fixed  
 accordingly; but that they first p<sup>r</sup>sent the Charge thereof to  
 the Com<sup>rs</sup> of the County Courts for their allowance which if  
 Refused that then Satisfaction be made for the same out of  
 the s<sup>d</sup> Quarter part lodged in M<sup>r</sup> Platers hands as afores<sup>d</sup> and  
 that the other half be transmitted to Cap<sup>t</sup> Pagan there to  
 Remain untill it be seen what Occasion there will be &<sup>ca</sup>.

Whitehall Ordered that M<sup>r</sup> Plater get ready the Lists and Acco<sup>t</sup> of  
 shiping this year, to be sent by Cap<sup>t</sup> Barbar or Cap<sup>t</sup> Pellew  
 at the farthest.

Ord<sup>r</sup> to the Colonels for to change the Gun Powder &<sup>ca</sup> Ordered that the Colonel of each respective  
 County within this province give Notice to the  
 severall Officers under their Command having the  
 Custody of any publick Powder, that they take  
 Care (where they find any of the barr<sup>ls</sup> deficient) for to get  
 them new hoopt, and upon Arrivall of the ffeet, th<sup>t</sup> they get  
 Whitehall all the s<sup>d</sup> Powder changed; And it is hereby further Ordered  
 that the Severall Collecto<sup>rs</sup> Speake to all the Masters of Ships  
 at their Entry making and treat with them about it, and  
 acquaint them it will be taken as a kindness done to the  
 Countrey in the Exchanging the Same, which to be proposed  
 pound for pound, but rather then faile they are to make some  
 Small allowance.

Ann Smith Ord<sup>rd</sup> to be Reprieved. Vpon Signing a Warr<sup>t</sup> of Execution against an  
 Indian and English Woman, persons Condemned  
 for Murther.

Whitehall Proposed whether the s<sup>d</sup> Woman (called Ann Smith) now  
 lying under Sentence of Death for murthering of a Negro  
 boy, shall be Reprieved or not; it being Represented that She  
 is very penitent & may deserve mercy; Whereupon the  
 Sherriffe being Sent for and the s<sup>d</sup> matter being debated the  
 Sherriffe is asked, if in Case a Repreive should be Granted,  
 whether or no he would be Content with what Work She  
 might doe, and not put the Countrey to Charge, untill his  
 Ma<sup>ts</sup> pleasure shall be known therein who Says he will be  
 Content with her work without putting the Countrey to  
 Charge; Resolved thereupon that She be Reprieved, but that  
 the thing be kept private and not made known untill She has  
 made her Speach at the place of Execution, understanding  
 She has Something which burthens her Conscience to discover,  
 which she deferrs till then.
