Ordered that the Colonel of each County within this province give Notice & Strict directions to the Officers of the Severall Troops & Companies within their respective Counties, that the militia under their Command take Care to furnish themselves with Arms and Amunition (this f fleet) pursuant to the directions of the Act of Assembly under pain of being proceeded ag<sup>t</sup> according to the Utmost Severity of the Law, there being a Considerable quantity of Such things now to be had and Considering the great price Tob<sup>o</sup> now Yeilds, But where it appears the s<sup>d</sup> things cannot possibly be purchased by Some persons this f fleet, that such persons then fail not to send to procure the same by the next opportunity, (und<sup>r</sup> like penalty) Tobacco being likely to Continue a Good Commodity; And to the End all persons may have due Notice, it is hereby further Ordered that the Sherriffs make publication hereof in all Churches Chappells and other publick places of meeting within their respective Counties and Signifye th<sup>t</sup> his Ex<sup>ncy</sup> in Person does (God willing) intend to see what posture the Militia of the Severall Counties is in, this f fall.
