

Ship in Ord<sup>r</sup> to have them punished as Pirates and Common Robbers upon the high Seas; And whereas we have since the Issuing the s<sup>d</sup> Proclamation received further Information from the s<sup>d</sup> Govern<sup>r</sup> and Company of Merchants, Trading to the East Indies, That the s<sup>d</sup> Hen: Every hath changed his name, And now goes by the name of Henry Bridgman, and that James Cray, Thomas Summerton, Edward Kirwood, W<sup>m</sup> Down, John Reddy, John Stroger, Nath: Pike, Peter Loanes, Henry Adams, ffran: ffrennier, Thomas Johnson, Jos: Dawson, Sam<sup>l</sup> Dawson, James Lewis, John Sparks, Joseph Goss, Charles ffalconer, James Murray, Robert Rich, John Miller, John King, Edward Savill, William Philips, Thomas Jope, and Thomas Belisha, together with severall others whose names are not yet discover<sup>d</sup> (amongst whom were ffifty two ffrenchmen, ffourteen Danes, & others of other Nations) were with the s<sup>d</sup> Henry Every alias Bridgman in the s<sup>d</sup> Ship Phansie, When the Severall Acts of Piracy were comitted, and were Aiding and Assisting therein and Shared in the Plunder so by them Pyratically taken, to the Amount of One Thousand pounds a man or thereabouts; And whereas we are Inform<sup>d</sup>, That the s<sup>d</sup> Henry Every alias Bridgman, with Severall other Persons above Named, have since they comitted such Acts of Piracy left the s<sup>d</sup> Ship in the Island of Providence, and are Arrived in Ireland in two Small Sloops and have there dispersed themselves, Some of w<sup>ch</sup> persons Remain there and others are Come into this Kingdom and the Kingdom of Scotland, as two of their Accomplices, who are now Taken and in Custody, have Confessed and Declared: We have therefore thought fit (by the Advice of his Ma<sup>ty</sup> most hon<sup>ble</sup> Privy Councill) to issue this Proclamation, hereby Declaring That the s<sup>d</sup> Henry Every alias Bridgman, together with the s<sup>d</sup> Severall persons above named, and others Englishmen, Scotchmen & fforreign<sup>s</sup> to the number of about One hundred and Thirty, did Steal and Runn away with the s<sup>d</sup> Ship from the Port of Corunna in Spain; and th<sup>t</sup> neither the s<sup>d</sup> Henry Every als Bridgman, nor any of the Persons above Nam<sup>d</sup> had any Comission or Authority from his Ma<sup>ty</sup> to Comānd the s<sup>d</sup> Ship or the men therein; but that the s<sup>d</sup> Henry Every alias Bridgman, and the Severall other persons above Nam<sup>d</sup> and such others as were with them in the s<sup>d</sup> Ship are Pyrates and Robbers upon the high Seas, And we do hereby Charge and Comānd all his Ma<sup>ty</sup> Admiralls, Captains and other Officers at Sea, and all his Ma<sup>ty</sup> Govern<sup>rs</sup> and Comānd<sup>s</sup> of any fforts Castles or other places in his Ma<sup>ty</sup> Plantations and all other Officers and persons whatsoever, to Seize and Apprehend the s<sup>d</sup> Henry Every alias Bridgman, James Cray, Thomas Summerton, Edward Kerwood, W<sup>m</sup> Down, John Reddy, John
