Whitehall Oath to be You do swear that the Accot of the Tobo by you taken by the now given, Shiped on board the this prsent Severall Mastrs of voyage is a true & Iust Accot both of the Tobacco Ships &ca in hogsheads and Bulk, and that no person or persons whatsoever besides had to doe or were actually concern'd in the Shiping on board any other Tobacco than the Accot now given, and that you do not intend to take any more Tobacco on board this preent Voyage nor suffer the same to be done, without giving an accot thereof to the Kings Officer &c<sup>ca</sup> before you depart the province.
