A Proclama Whereas by advice of his Mats honrble Councill tion abt the Exportation and at the speciall instance and Request of the house of Burgesses, I caused a Proclamation to issue under the Broad Seal of this his Mats province of Maryland, bearing date the 15th day of October, last past, strictly prohibiting the Exportacon of Corn; And fforasmuch as it hath pleased Almighty God of his infinite goodness to bless this province this year with plentiful Crops of Corn &cca insomuch that it is thought expedient the sd Proclamation should be now taken off and abolished; I do therefore (by Advice of his Mats honrble Councill & at the spll instance and Request of the House of Burgesses in Assembly now conven'd) hereby Publish and declare the sd Proclamation to be null and void and every clause and thing therein contain'd, Utterly abolished & of none Effect, Commanding the Sheriffs to make Proclamacon hereof in all places within their respective Counties; Given at the Port of Annapolis under the broad seal of the province this 29th day of September 1696, and in the Eigth year of the Reign of our Soveraign Lord King William the Third &cca
