It is Represented to the Hon<sup>rd</sup> the Justices of the provinciall Court how th<sup>t</sup> upon a late Complaint of the hon<sup>ble</sup> Sr Thomas Laurence Barron<sup>t</sup> Secretary of this Province in Relation to M<sup>r</sup> Henry Wriothesley Chief Clerk of the s<sup>d</sup> Court Setting forth th<sup>t</sup> no Judgm<sup>ts</sup> (there passed) had by him been Entred up since Nov<sup>r</sup> last was a Twelmonth; upon which his Ex<sup>ncy</sup> upon further Examination into the matter thought it absolutely necessary for his Ma<sup>ts</sup> Service and the Good of the Countrey to put the s<sup>d</sup> Wriothesley into the Custody of the Sherriff of Ann Arrundell County, with caution not to Suffer him to go from without the Limits of the Town untill he had perfected and made up his s<sup>d</sup> Records &c<sup>ca</sup> with Ord<sup>r</sup> likewise to the Severall provinciall Court Attorneys for their personall appearance at this Court in Ord<sup>r</sup> to inspect that matter & particularly those judgm<sup>ts</sup> wherein they have been actually concern<sup>d</sup> as by the respective Ord<sup>rs</sup> remaining with the high Sherriff and the Severall Attorneys may more at large appear—It is now thought Expedient that the s<sup>d</sup> Wriothesley
